

Specific comments carried over from the December 11, 2020 Operations Committee meeting not considered at the January 8, 2021 Operations committee

Goal A

Policy 6 and Action 7 should be reversed.

Goal C

Possible new Policy – Homes potentially impacted by chemical fires or releases that may need to shelter-in-place need to be able to do so safely, with adequate infiltration rates and protection from heat. These concepts can also be incorporated into Policies C-4 and C-5.

Possible new Policy – Support continued public education to make sure all residents are provided adequate education about less toxic alternatives to household hazardous products, including pesticides, and education about the safe handling, storage and disposal of Household hazardous Waste, including pharmaceuticals. Ensure there are adequate options for HHW disposal for residents that don't drive.

Goal E

Concerned about the use of the word “equal” in goal. Is this really possible?

Goal F

Action F-4 – make sure the criteria established considers the type of hazmat being transported and the air pollution from the trucks.

Goal K –

Define “resilient” better – Need policies and actions that address resiliency

Possible new policy – Ensure residents and businesses that live near hazards are adequately educated about the risks from near-by hazardous materials and have adequate ways to protect themselves.

Climate Equity

New policy - no new facilities using or storing hazardous materials to be sited in areas impacted by projected sea level rise without adequate preplanning for that eventuality.
