

# CoCo LEAD Plus (Contra Costa Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion)

## Antioch Outreach and Meeting Summary

October 30, 2019**

### **Introductions:**

Here today to discuss the county MDT outreach for Antioch PILOT for 6-8 weeks - interdisciplinary and interagency.

**Short explanation of COCO LEAD plus:** Prop 47 program that diverts those arrested for low level offences in the city of Antioch. The goal of COCO LEAD is reduction in arrests and entry into the system.

**Why is coordinated outreach important:** Multi-disciplinary collaboration used to increase engagement opportunities. Could cut down time until initial enrollment. Relationship can break down barriers for change. There have been examples such as Rebecca Sanders going out in coordination with outreach resulting in effective engagement.

### **How can each agency benefit?**

**HealthRIGHT360 (HR360):** Part of their role has been looking for people for engagement. This can be challenging. The benefit is obvious.

**Coordinated Outreach Referral and Engagement (CORE):** More resources with service delivery.

**Bay Area Community Resources (BACR):** Linkage to services after the MSC was closed. Reconnecting is important, expedited services is key.

**Health Care for the homeless (HCH):** Insufficient Mental Health services, interactions have helped create a web of better connections, people may be missing out on what is available. Potential enrollments could be helpful. Case management ratio? What is the current capacity?

**HUME Center:** Greater outreach is important, many homeless clients, some are lost track of, recently expanded their contract with the county. Those who were not engaging with Pitt mental health and need extra support are being referred. New contract starts in July with SUD counselor, vocation, and housing will be added to their team. They do have some case managers that do light outreach.

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**Antioch Police Department (APD):** Anticipate increased enrollment and outreach would increase services and stop the draining of resources from the PD and divert them where is needed.

**Behavioral Health Department Forensics:** Clinics primary focus is improving the CCLP program and using MET to increase location services. MET can assist with location according to Deb Thomas.

### Second Segment:

#### Ideal number of people is 3, three different types of outreach:

- 1) looking for individuals 2-3 people
- 2) Communal approach 3-5 people to divide and conquer
- 3) Informational (Loaves and Fishes) put out a table and let people come to us (light on resources)

**Resources:** HR360 Largely relying on donations. Large warehouse in SF that they can go to monthly. 89 referrals total 46 enrolled with 45 active, 42 referrals not enrolled. Of those 42, 27 have not been contacted, and others have not had interest. 70% enrollment rate. Once enrolled, the case managers have split caseloads which is 25 and 20. They subcontract out for CBT, Restorative Justice, Contra Costa interfaith Housing. 200 people can be enrolled. 10 of the 45 enrolled have been enrolled in the last two months.

#### All of these options require physical resources:

**Transportation:** CORE has a vehicle that can be utilized, HR360 van, unmarked vehicle.

**Uniforms:** COCO LEAD Plus uniforms.

**Referrals:** Patrice asks if these referrals can be cross referenced in the partner systems.

**Communication:** How can we share information?

#### Scheduling:
